

ELECTRIC VEHICLES: ARE THEY REALLY ECO-FRIENDLY?

The hype of electric vehicles has indeed increased significantly. The Indian government has created momentum through its Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of (Hybrid &). Electric Vehicles schemes that encourage, and in some segments mandates the adoption of electric vehicles (EV). They set a goal of reaching 30% EV penetration by 2030. But this 'Rupees 260 crore subsidy' doesn't come without a reason and global warming is just a mask to hide the real issue.

Indeed, India is the fourth major contributor to nature harming emissions globally. A study done by The Energy and Resources institute(TERI) shows that 34% of it comes from Delhi, while 28% comes from the entire Auto-sector.To our surprise, the further breakdown shows the contribution of buses and cars combined at just 3%, infact government is adopting European Norms of BS-IV and BS-VI to reduce it further prevaid the surprise of the House of the Section of the Section of Section 21.3% to the emission of greenhouse gases while fossil fuel retrieval and processing contribute 11.3%. So basically the increase in demand for electricity due to EV's, in turn, causes more pollution. To let you off the hook, here is the real face behind the mask. According to a report published in the "Economic Times". India meets over 80 percent of its oil demand through imports. A rise in crude oil prices then hurts the rupee-dollar exchange rate. A fall in the rupee lowers CDP. So increasing the economy is the real reason and environmental concern is just a mask. This issue isn't in the limelight yet, but as an engineer, we must know.
