

About the Seminars:

Team work, Confidence building, leadership skills and hard work:

A seminar on the "Importance of teamwork, leadership skills, confidence

building and hard work" was held on 18th December 2021 by Mr. Irfan Khan, a recognized Life coach and a certified facilitator from the Dale Carnegie institute.

The aim of the seminar was to provide inputs of confidence building and leadership skills to the new members of the orators' club and help them develop the skill. The guest lecture as well coordinated by Dr. Shabana Thayniath and Ms. Farha Shah.

The session scheduled on 25th January 2022 at 2.00 pm. The event was conducted in Google Classroom and the guest speaker was Mr. Vishal Mani Tripathi, an IES Officer and Director at the Ministry of Defense. The session was attended by Principal Mahipal Singh Rawat, Prof Majeed, HOD Basic Sciences, faculty, and students.

Cracking the UPSC Exams is a very difficult task as it requires constant effort and determination. Many students aspire to become UPSC civil servants but not all of them have clarity on how to prepare for the exams. Due to the structure and enormity of this exam, the young aspirants especially students are sometimes left with a plethora of doubts. Keeping that in mind, the webinar primarily focused on the challenges posed as well as the different strategies to crack the exam.

The webinar commenced with the objective of the webinar by Ms. Noor ul Huda, faculty EITK and with a welcome note and introduction of the speaker by Ms. Rushda Babukhan from the orators' club. The speaker set the floor for the session by giving a wellstructured presentation that gave a brief

overview of the UPSC Civil Services Examination. The presentation focused on students regarding enlightening the the structure and pattern of the exam. It also gave an understanding of how to get into these services by giving the students an idea of the various exams offered by the Government. The presentation also gave an elaborate insight into Engineering Services Examination the including the subjects being offered as well as its recruitment process.



The speaker motivated the students to join the UPSC services as it gives a very good opportunity to understand our country from all aspects. He even highlighted the latest developments in our country to understand the contribution of the civil servants in the progress of the nation.

The speaker gave suggestions, tips, and guidance to the students to crack the UPSC exams and also spoke of his journey and experiences. He suggested the students constantly update their knowledge on current affairs and emphasized that students should be dedicated and continuous in their efforts and preparation.

Towards the end, there was a very interactive question and answer session where the questions asked covered the recent updates concerning the services as well as other technical and procedural related topics.

The session concluded with an appreciation message by Dr. Shabana Thayniath and a vote

of thanks by Adnan from the Orators club to the speaker and the students gave their feedback. The session was attended by 130 students. Overall the session was very informative and comprehensive as it focused on all important aspects and the students were able to take back a lot of valuable inputs that would certainly motivate them to achieve their goals. The event started at 10:50am with the introduction and addressing by an exe-com member Ibrahim. The guests were invited and the audience were given a brief about Intellectual Property Day.



MUN Workshop:

Model United Nations is an academic simulation of the United Nations where students play the role of delegates from different countries and attempt to solve realworld issues with the policies and perspectives of their assigned country. For example, a student may be assigned the United Kingdom and will have to solve global topics such as nuclear non-proliferation or climate change from the policies and perspectives of the United Kingdom.

To help students get started with their first MUN, *Dept. Of English and Orators Club MJCET* took an initiative to conduct a workshop that shed light on the importance of participating in various MUNs, its outcomes, the overall functionality of a MUN, and what it is all about.

The Workshop was divided into 2 segments.

He emphasized United that students use this MUN experience to become representatives of the United Nations; student ambassadors to build a better understanding of the Organization -- what it is, what it does and what it can do. The role of students was highlighted as the catalysts for change by creating social networks in support of MUN and as future leader's youth can come up with

innovative approaches to help confront the challenges facing the global community.

Dr. Shabana Thayniath spoke about the need of conducting MUN by the orators' club. She highlighted the need for communication skills, analytical skills, negotiating skills for the participants. Negotiation and compromise with other delegates to secure their votes, and most important Public speaking skills are required to make speeches, present resolutions and amendments, or ask POIs, MUN helps to develop personality development.
